On a Spírítual Note ...

Jesus is tough: he demands a lot! When his disciples ask him about faith, he gives them an earful!

Jesus is a good Jew: he knows his Bible. He remembers the Book of the Prophet Habakkuk, and today's first reading, where the prophet asks God to explain himself, because of all the evil he sees. God tells him, in other words, to mind his own business, and to trust God more. Do not doubt that God will take care of his people, but also don't try to give God directions. Jesus knows that God also gave the same kind of answer to Job, when he was trying to question God.

So Jesus tells the disciples that they must not try to control God, or try to bargain with him. Don't try to get what you want from God by reminding him of all the good things you have done for him! You are nothing but a worker who just does his or her job! When Jesus asked the Father to let the cup of suffering pass him by, he added, "Not my will, but yours be done." (Luke 22:42) Jesus, more than anyone, might have felt justified to say, "Look at all I have done for you!" But he bowed his head to the will of the Father. And only by way of suffering, humiliation, torture, and unjustified death did he arrive at the Resurrection.

Should we expect a better deal than Jesus?

God asks us to trust him, and to trust in his love. Let go, don't try to control, don't try to bargain, - just be his child!
