Advent Season



Food for thought from Fr. Mekonnen


The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming." (CCC 524) Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

Even though the Church calls Advent "the long preparation" for Christmas, it may feel like the shortest preparation. The busyness of shopping, and the worldly aspects of the "holiday season" make time fly by. Then, we wake up on Gaudete Sunday wondering where the first three weeks of Advent went. So, I invite you to pause for a moment and think about how we as a church family can become busy with serving our Blessed Lord by being intentional about prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during this Advent Season. The reason priests wear purple during the seasons of both Advent and Lent is because it is penitential season. Penitential means the activity of offering up sacrifices such as fasting and almsgiving. This is how the Church teaches us to be alert and ready for the feasts of Easter and Christmas. Just think about the great distance our Lady and St.Joesph travel at night from Nazareth to Bethlehem which was 70 miles away with very little of their belongings. That was how they celebrated Advent because it was the will of our heavenly Father, and so, Emmanuel, our Savior is the first link. Our Lady and St.Joesph became the second and third link. We as believers are called to be a link as well, because of our faith filled relationship with Jesus. Prayer is a simple way to become; that link that becomes a blessing; that puts a smile on someone's face and the warmth of peace into our heart.

Advent Prayer Believers Chain

To begin our Countdown to Christmas, you will receive a link to a prayer chain. Each link will have a prayer intention written on it. I ask that you pray for the intention written on the link beginning with the first Sunday of Advent (December 3, 2023) until Christmas day and return it on January 7th. Pick a special time each day-a time that you will remember. Then say the prayer which is written on that link for the special intention.




