

Food for thought from Fr. Mekonnen

How do we bring comfort to Jesus?

How do we bring comfort to Jesus?

In the first reading of Isaiah, we hear God's devotion to His beloved people as He says to us "Comfort, give comfort to my people," (40:1). It is God Himself who comforts us, in our human weakness, wether it is physical or spiritual, as He reveals Himself as the Good Shepherd who "feeds his flock; in his arms he gathers the lambs, carrying them in his bosom, and leading the ewes with care." (40:11). It is easy to see and hear how we as lambs are in need of God's comfort, but is it possible to comfort God as well? God calls us to have a true devotion to Him alone, and this act in itself brings comfort to our Blessed Lord. St John the Baptist is the voice in the wilderness that reveal his true devotion to God by faithfully preaching "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." We experience comfort in times of loneliness and joy whenever we hear the voice of our family members or friends because we believe they have a sincere love for us. Jesus is Divine Word made flesh, and although Israel are ignorant of God's presence. Nevertheless St John the Baptist receives Jesus with a living faith that welcomes the King of Heaven by preaching the good news which is a spiritual work of mercy. I invited you to practice one of the spiritual or corporal works of mercy in preparation for Christmas during this advent season. Take one strip of paper with you after Mass and write down that act of mercy you practiced during the advent season and bring it back on Christmas evening or day. That strip of paper will be sowed onto a blanket and wrapped around the baby Jesus statute. Those acts of mercy is the concrete manner in which we comfort Jesus by seeing His real presence in each other. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (Part Three: Life in Christ).


The Corporal Works of Mercy

 - 4. Comfort the sorrowful
 - 5.Bear wrongs patiently




