

*Food for thought from Fr. Mekonnen* Why and when do We celebrate the birth of Christ ?

Christmas is the solemnity in which we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ and this is reason for our joy. Birthdays, weddings, anniversaries and graduations are celebrated all in one day's time. However, this is not the case regarding the celebration of the birth of the only Savior of the world. There are two principal feasts in the Liturgical Year: Easter and Christmas. These are both solemnities (and holy days of obligation) and in the current Liturgical Calendar, are the only feasts that have octaves attached (the 1962 calendar also has an octave of Pentecost). **A holy day of obligation is equivalent to a Sunday,which means all Catholics are obligated to keep the Sabbath Holy by attending the Holy Mass on those days of Solemnities.** 

Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God | January 1 Ascension of Jesus | May 21 (moved in most dioceses from May 18 to the following Sunday)


The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary | August 15 All Saints Day | November 1 The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary | December 8 Christmas Day | December 25

Solemnities are festive and exceptional days; the highest ranked feasts of the liturgical calendar marked with special characteristics. "11. Solemnities are counted as the principal days in the calendar and their observance begin with Evening Prayer I of the preceding day. Some Solemnities also have their own vigil Mass (for use when Mass is celebrated in the evening of the preceding day). The celebration of Easter and Christmas, the two greatest solemnities, continues for eight days, with each octave governed by its own rules. (General Norms of the Liturgical Calendar)"

There are institutions that give a Christmas break on the day of Christmas, and even following that date. The purpose for Catholic institutions to give this break, is to avail ourselves the time to offer up worship to God within the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. God rested on the Sabbath and so we are called as children of God rest in God through worshipping God as Church Family.




