

Food for thought from Fr. Mekonnen



How can God who is all powerful and Almighty be at the same time the perfect example of humility? I think we can sometimes misunderstand and underappreciate the virtue of humility, which of course is not one of the foundational theological virtues of faith, hope and charity, but is none the less the foundation of our spiritual life. Some may think of humility as some kind of self-hatred in which individuals walk around with their heads down beating themselves up by talking about either their real or imaginary weakness or sinfulness. Some may even conceive humility as a deep feeling of inadequacy in effectively completing some assigned task or mission. Some may view humility as a virtue you exercise and receive by doing external acts of penances without any counseling from their spiritual director. These definitions of humility are counterfeits and our Lord who is eternal Truth reveals this to us whenever these thoughts may cloud our judgments. These are only a few and are not an exhausted list of ways we can fall into the pitfalls of pride. Pride is a very subtle vice that can easily creep into our little inner world like air pollution without us even noticing its deadly presence. Notice the thread that weaves all these actions is an intense focus on "self" as if we as earthlings are the center of the universe and everything else including God revolves around us. Thus, pride gives way to a perception of a fantasy world in which we live on an island but if there are others on this island, they are only present to serve us. Of course, because of our identity as adopted children of God we can easily see how the eternal Son, our blessed Lord, is the center of the universe. This is made clear to us whenever we look upon the crucifix because it is there, we see in a concrete manner how humility Incarnate shines forth drawing all sinners to Himself through the rays of the Holy Spirit. Our Lord said, "learn of Me for I Am meek and humble of heart." We learn that our Lord humbled Himself in coming down from His heavenly glory to be born in a cold stable filled with hay and animals. Archbishop Fulton Sheen wrote in his book "The priest is not his own" our Lord would not stop there, but even humble Himself in being a "priest-victim, which was never done before as the priests in the Old Testament always offered a vicarious animal, but never themselves as the sacrificial offering to God." Thus, we learn that humility is simply an acknowledgment of the truth in that we are creatures created in the image and likeness of God. It is because of the fact we are creatures that we have this dependence on God for everything from existence to graces to grow in holiness. Our Lady is our next model of humility as she offers up praises and gratitude to our heavenly Father for giving her His beloved Son, Jesus through the Holy Spirit in her Magnificat Canticle. Thus, learn humility is an attitude of gratitude towards God and neighbor. Our Lady experienced joy as she prophesied in the canticle that all generations will be blessed. We learn from our Blessed Mother that an acknowledgment of talents, blessings, and graces we receive is not prideful if we bear witness that they all come from God. Just think about children who receive Christmas presents from their parents who instead of thanking their parents instead only complain about the gifts or simply love the gift more than their parents. God in His infinite wisdom and humility makes it easy for us in that He transforms ordinary bread and wine to become His sacred Body and Blood, so that there is no separation of the Gift from the Giver. It is interesting that even the holy Eucharist means thanksgiving.




