Food for thought from Fr. Mekonnen



Why Should We Go To Confession To a Priest, When We Can Just Confess Our Sins to God?

One way of perceiving the proper role of the Church is to view Her as a hospital; this was a popular analogy among the early church fathers. St Augustine wrote, "The Church is a hospital for sinners." It was through Baptism that we became healed from original sin and became adopted children of God, but what remains is concupiscence, which is an inclination towards sin. We could look at this as a vaccination that we receive as infants, in which our body can build up our spiritual immune system against sin. Our blessed Lord, who is our Divine Physician, gives us the Sacrament of Confession so that we may be healed from our wounds, because He had the foresight to understand that we would continue to struggle with either serious or venial sins, even after our baptism. God permits us to have concupiscence because in His infinite wisdom, He desires to gives us the opportunity to enter the spiritual battle of overcoming temptations by way of His graces, which is necessary to exercise our spiritual muscles of faith animated by charity.

Our Blessed Mother is the nurse, who gives us instructions and encourages us to trust her Son, the Divine Physician, in going to confession. We may not go to confession regularly, or at all, because we are filled with fear because we misunderstand what our Lord is doing in this sacrament of healing, which is a real miracle. I read an article online about the "The true story of the miraculous intercession of the Virgin Mary in 1944 to prisoner Claude Newman of Mississippi" in which he learned about confession from our Lady and he said "The Lady told me that when we go to confession, we are kneeling down not before a priest, but we're kneeling down by the Cross of Her Son. And that when we are truly sorry for our sins, and we confess our sins, the Blood He shed flows down over us and washes us free from all sins." This precious Blood of Christ is like a blood transfusion we need for us to make a recovery from the wounds we inflict upon ourselves through serious sins. Some Catholics may be afraid of confessing their sins before a priest, even though the priest is necessary for the sacrament; nevertheless, he is the instrument that God has chosen to use in which Christ works this miracle. "You know, the Lady said that Confession is something like a telephone. We talk through the priest to God, and God talks back to us through the priest." I would like to add on that there are no exceptions to confession, in that even priests, bishops, and popes must receive this sacrament from another priest for them to receive the healing power of Christ. The Church is the hospital that not only brings us healing, but She also gives us heavenly food which is the Holy Eucharist. The best way to prepare for reception of the Holy Eucharist is confession, because our relationship with God, self and neighbor is reconciled as we become fully mature in our spiritual life focused towards heaven. When we pray the Act of Contrition with true sorrow and a firm resolution to sin no more, we bring joy to our heavenly Father, because He desires that no one should suffer fatal wounds from sin that leads to a spiritual death. Our Lord said, "I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance" (Lk15:7). It is necessary to confess our sins both in private and before our Lord through the priest in the Sacrament of Confession.
