



Food for thought from Fr. Mekonnen



Why Should I Attend Mass on Sundays When I can Just Pray to God at Home?"

This may be a question that many Catholics, who are not attending Mass regularly on Sundays, or those who rarely attend throughout the year are pondering in their hearts. We can help them by knowing what the Church teaches pertaining to our weekly worship service. Throughout this article, I will be making references from St. John Paul II's Apostolic letter "Dei Domini" on keeping the Lord's Day holy, because it is a part of God's mysterious plan to communicate truth to the faithful through the Popes, who are the Servants of God' on earth throughout the ages. It is a part of being human to seek and desire to both hear and know truth, because God created us this way from the beginning. This tradition of going to Mass on Sundays is not another new innovative "man-made" tradition, but rather it is an ancient "God made" tradition. The Second Vatican Council states: "Every seven days, the Church celebrates the Easter mystery. This is a tradition going back to the Apostles, taking its origin from the actual day of Christ's Resurrection – a day thus appropriately designated 'the Lord's Day."

Most people prefer to celebrate their birthday on the exact date; Our parents would even keep pictures or video footage, to commemorate that day. This could be another way of understanding how we, as Christians, should honor, remember, and celebrate the Easter mystery as the hallmark of our new birth as adopted children of God. The "Easter" day is the climax of the Church's liturgical calendar because this is how God has willed it to re-create humanity through Christ and the Holy Spirit. Thus, the joy we have as Christians is rooted in our faith in Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Given these different points that set this day apart it is easier to see how "Sunday appears as the supreme day of

faith." It is the day when, by the power of the Holy Spirit, who is the Church's living 'memory,' the first appearance of the Risen Lord becomes an event renewed in the "today" of each of Christ's disciples."

Everyone would agree that when people go on vacation they would go with family or friends to enjoy some rest and relaxation. It is our actions that reveal more concretely what we hold to be true and so if we honestly believe God is our heavenly Father then, we will listen carefully to what He reveals to us about resting in Him through His beloved Son. The theme of "God's rest" and the rest which He offered to the people of the Exodus when they entered the Promised Land; "Sabbath rest," into which Christ himself has entered by His Resurrection. Through our baptism, we have become incorporated into a much larger family that comes together every Sunday; we come to seek our rest in God by participating in the Mass, which is the "work of God." When we attend Mass every Sunday, we are graced with the opportunity to worship God as one Body with billions of other Catholics all over the world. Every Sunday, when we offer worship to God in the manner that He revealed to the Church, we are also united to our loved ones in heaven and purgatory, and in communion with the Saints, because they too bear witness to the truth of their identity as Christians. Salvation is a group experience; Can you choose to be a part of that group?


