Why do we have processions?



Thousands of Philadelphia fans enjoyed a victory parade when the Phillies won the World Series in 2008 and again, when the Eagles won the super-bowl in 2018. That procession was a way to help facilitate a participation in these teams's victory over all of the other teams, that they had to defeat in order to win in their league. I am a Phillies and an Eagles' fan, however, I have spoken to several Philadelphians who are not fans of either team. I do support these teams because I live here in Philadelphia, but I'm not a fanatic that follow statics and watch every game religiously. 


