



What is Lectio Divina?

The Latin phrase "lectio divina" may be translated as "divine reading." Lectio divina is a method for praying with the Scriptures. As one reads and invites the Word to become a transforming lens that brings the events of daily living into focus, one can come to live more deeply and find the presence of God more readily in the events of each day. The method of lectio divina follows four steps: lectio (reading), meditatio (meditation), contemplatio (contemplation), and oratio (prayer).

READ SLOWLY the following Scripture two or three times.

7 Calling the Twelve together, he began to send them out two by two, with authority over unclean spirits. 8 He instructed them to take nothing for their journey except a walking staff—no bread, no sack, no money in their purses. 9 They were to wear sandals but not to take along a second tunic. 10 He said to them, "Whenever you enter a house, you are to stay there until you leave the area. 11 And if any will not welcome you and refuse to listen to you, leave them immediately and shake off the dust that is on your feet in testimony against them." 12 Then they set off and preached the need for repentance. 13 They cast out many demons, and they anointed with oil many people who were sick and cured them. Mark 6:7-13 (New Catholic Bible)

MEDITATION

After the reading, take some time to reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions:

- What word or words in this passage caught your attention?
- What in this passage comforted you?
- What in this passage challenged you?

CONTEMPLATION

Read the Scripture again, followed by this reflection:

What conversion of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me? No food, no sack, no money in their belts. How often do I rely too much on my possessions instead of on God's providence? How can I grow in detachment from my worldly goods? Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. What makes me feel welcome in my church? How can I extend the same welcome to others? So they went off and preached repentance. From what sin do I need to repent? How can I foster greater reconciliation in my family and community? How can I make my life a gift for others in charity?

JOURNAL

Write out all your answers so that you can fully understand what the Holy Spirit is saying to you personally and the response you give back to Him. Lectio Divina is not a monologue, but rather a dialogue between you and God.

CHALLANGE

What will you do for Jesus this week?
