





The Latin phrase "lectio divina" may be translated as "divine reading." Lectio divina is a method for praying with the Scriptures. As one reads and invites the Word to become a transforming lens that brings the events of daily living into focus, one can come to live more deeply and find the presence of God more readily in the events of each day. The method of lectio divina follows four steps: lectio (reading), meditatio (meditation), contemplatio (contemplation), and oratio (prayer).

READ SLOWLY the following Scripture two or three times.

30 The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught. 31 He said to them, "Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat. 32 And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves. 33 Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. 34 As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things. Mark 6:30-34 (New Revised Standard Version Catholic Edition)

MEDITATION After the reading, take some time to reflect in silence on one or more of the following questions:

- What word or words in this passage caught your attention?
- What in this passage comforted you?
- What in this passage challenged you?

CONTEMPLATION Read the Scripture again, followed by this reflection:

What conversion (turning away of sin with help of God's grace) of mind, heart, and life is the Lord asking of me? "The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught." With whom can I gather to learn about and share my faith? Where do I meet Jesus in my everyday life? "They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them." Do I hasten to the Lord or rush past him? What keeps me from seeking the Lord and spending more time with him? When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them. Who is in need of my compassion? How can I express that compassion more effectively? How can I make my life a gift for others in charity? If possible, take time this week to pray and share faith with a group of family or friends.

JOURNAL

Write out all your answers so that you can fully understand what the Holy Spirit is saying to you personally, and the response you give back to Him. Lectio Divina is not a monologue, but rather a dialogue between you and God.

CHALLANGE

How will you serve Jesus this week?
